


BUVUMA KALANGALA Legend DISTRICTS WITH MOST REGISTERED CASES DISTRICTS_2018_UTM_36N








■ PEOPLE IN HIGHLY URBANISED AREAS LIKE KAMPALA ARE AFFECTED MOST IN UGANDA



STATUS OF SPATIAL PLANNING

Over 8M Ugandans (19.7%) live below national poverty line, increase in total public debt, grew from 22.4% in 2010 to a projected 41% of GDP by the end of FY2019/20.





IMPACTS

By end of June 2020, Uganda had registered over 21,260 cases of child neglect, sexual and physical abuse

Developed Recovery Strategies

Government's covid-19 relief programs, like food and other relief aid, were directed primarily at the 1.5 million people living in urban areas in Greater Kampala Metropolitan Area.

- A UGX 304 billion supplementary budget was approved by parliament on 7 April to facilitate an immediate response to covid-19.
- Government launched the national response fund to raise over UGX 170 billion from the public through this fund to support efforts to curb the spread of covid-19
- The bank of Uganda lowered its lending rate from 9% to 8% in April 2020.





Developed Recovery Strategies

- Traffic jams costing Uganda over US\$800m (over sh2.8trillion) in lost GDP annually.
